INDIANAPOLIS – The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (DPW) announced today the completion of strip-patching operations for the 2022 season. • Mayor Joe Hogsett joined City-County Council President Vop Osili and residents of the Riverside neighborhood to highlight passage of Proposal No. 310, which allocates funding for property tax relief for Marion County homeowners. As you might recall, we were able to fabricate and install 17 new signs back in 2019-20 with the size, topics, graphics and locations led by you! This round, each waterway will be about to determine some new signage -- approximately 2-4 per waterway (depending on the size you are interested in - larger, trailhead signs are more expensive than the smaller wayfinding ones).
