With a people-first approach, the SEND Properties team connects their renters with various resources in the area such as food assistance, financial planning/guidance, access to hygiene products, and overall support throughout the duration of their rental agreement.







The Standard

Located at: 1656 English Ave

1656 English Avenue was built in 1890 making this dual apartment rental and commercial space a historic wonder. There are 3 apartment rental units and 1 commercial space available for rent. Minutes away from Downtown Indianapolis and the Christian Park community. All apartments will feature a 1-bedroom, 1-bathroom, tall ceilings, modern touches, and windows that offer plenty of natural lighting.





Fountain View Apts

Located at: 1044 Shelby Street

Fountain View Apartments is a 22-unit apartment community located in Fountain Square, built in 1902. This landmark commercial building was constructed with brick and limestone by Prader and Kraas and was built to house commercial shops on the first level, with apartments and offices on the second. Now housing 55 and older, this apartment community offers convenience to locally-owned businesses and restaurants. Indy Reads Bookstore, IndyGo, and Bovaconti are just steps away from Fountain View.











East Street Flats

Located at: 1239 S. East Street

Located in the Bates-Hendricks neighborhood of Fountain Square. **Developed by Southeast Neighborhood Development, these** 1-bedroom, 1-bathroom apartment homes offer residents of this community tall ceilings, colorful interiors, private patios, and balconies. Residing at East Street Flats you can enjoy 128-acre Garfield Park, nearby shopping, restaurants, and other local businesses.





SEND Homes

Located at: Scattered Sites*

At SEND Homes you will find several homes for rent sizing from 1-, 2-, 3- and 4-bedroom homes! All our scattered site homes are located throughout the southeast side of Indianapolis.

Residential Rental Requirements



RESIDENT SELECTION CRITERIA

Management will not discriminate based on race, color, national origin, sex, age, disability, sexual orientation, gender identity or familial status in any phase of the occupancy process. Approved occupancy is 2 people per bedroom, plus one.

Eligibility

All applicants must be 18 years of age and complete an application for residency. All persons in the household 18 years of age or older will be required to complete an application as a leaseholder or an occupant. If the individual is completing an application for occupant status only, an application fee will apply.

Application

Misrepresentation, falsification, or failure to complete the application process will be reason for disqualification. Additionally, if an applicant's application or security deposit payment is returned for any reason, management reserves the right to deny this applicant. Please note, application fees and security deposits must be paid with certified funds, e.g., cashier's checks, money orders, etc. Approved applications are valid for 30 days from the date of application. Applications for residency which are not fulfilled within 30 days from date of application will be subject to re-screening for final acceptance. All applicants must submit a new application packet after 30 days.

Credit References

Management will run a credit check on all applicants.

- Landlord collections or judgments will be cause for denial.
- Any judgments or collections for medical or education will be disregarded.
- Bankruptcies must be discharged.
- Foreclosures cannot be active.
- Any applicant not possessing a social security number may be subject to completing other documentation.
- A lack of credit history will not be grounds for denial.
- In the event utility balances (defined as gas, electric, water/sewer or trash) appear on the credit report, the applicant would be denied, unless proven to have a zero balance.

Residential History

- Positive residential references will be required for the previous 1 (one) year for each applicant. In the case of home ownership, the mortgage account will be reviewed as a credit source.
- If an applicant has not lived in the United States for the past 2 (two) years, and we can't source a reference, a copy of the applicant's passport will be viewed, and the date of entry will be documented in the resident file.
- A negative landlord reference can be, but not limited to, the following: eviction, destruction of property, record of disturbances, disruptive or dangerous behavior, unsanitary conditions or poor housekeeping, chronic late payments or returned payments, or other lease violations.

- ❖ If a balance is owed to any previous landlord, the application will be denied.
- In the event of less than 1 (one) years residential history, a guaranty of lease or higher security deposit would be required.

Criminal Background

Management shall run a criminal report on all applicants. Any of the following may constitute a denial:

- Any felony conviction that shows a demonstrable risk to resident safety and/or property offenses against property, persons, domestic violence, firearms, organized crime, distribution or manufacturing of illegal drugs, sexual nature, and/or distribution of alcohol to minors, within the last five (5) years on file with any state, county, or federal court, unless applicant or criminal record has been pardoned, expunged, or vacated.
- Any violent crime felony and/or misdemeanor conviction during the last 5 (five) years prior to the date
 of application.
- Any applicant listed as a sex offender in any state.

Guaranty of Lease

A guaranty of lease/Co-signer may only be used as specified above. Guarantor must complete an application. Guarantor is also subject to credit approval.

SEND Properties Part in Affordable Housing

- According to the <u>Common Sense Institute's Indianapolis</u> <u>Metropolitan Area Housing Affordability Report</u>, the housing deficit (2022 figures) stands at between 18,852 and 61,238 in Indy. To meet projected population growth in the next five years, we need to build between 66,000 and 115,000 units.
- ▶ SEND Properties offers 75 rental opportunities, with a current waitlist of over 80 applicants as of 9/21/2023.
- The need for Affordable Housing in Indianapolis, Indiana is high Southeast Neighborhood Development plans to develop additional affordable rental units in 2024 to play a part in "closing the gap."
- > SEND Properties will continue to offer new and existing resources to renters to provide a better quality of life while residing in their rental homes.

SEND Properties LLC Waitlist

- Currently, we are on a waitlist for persons interested in housing opportunities with SEND Properties!
- ► Waitlist lengths are subject to change any persons who join the waitlist as of 9/21/23 will have a wait of 6 months or longer.
- Waitlist applications are placed on the waitlist based on the order the application was received.

- Any persons the age of 55 and older are encouraged to reach out immediately as waitlist lengths for Fountain View Apartments are significantly shorter currently!

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: What is the monthly rent amount for your homes?

A: With our wide variety of rental units, we do not have set amounts in place! Each home's rental amount is based on the bedroom size, square footage, and total allowable rent.

Q: What utilities are residents responsible for?

A: At Fountain View, SEND Properties pays for all utilities except for electricity (this includes water/sewer, trash, Wi-Fi, lawn care, pest control, etc.). At our other homes, residents are responsible for all utilities except for trash and lawn care.

Q: Why is your waitlist so long?

A: With the high demand for Affordable Housing in Indianapolis, Indiana, and few opportunities offered for affordable rental amounts, our waitlist will remain lengthy until more units are offered in the area.

Q: What is the best way for me to get information on your rental program?

A: By contacting our team at propertymanagement@sendcdc.org and joining our 2023 waitlist!

Q: Does SEND Properties offer any financial assistance?

A: Our team does not offer funding for financial assistance however; we are happy to provide any resources that we are aware of!




Indiana Joint Asthma Coalition (InJAC)


